COVID UPDATE as of 10/4/21

Last week, Jessica, our administrator, went room to room to deliver information on our current COVID status.

As you are aware, all staff and residents were COVID tested on Monday 10/4.

Our visitations remain the same with the exception that all **visitors must wear a** well fitted mask covering their nose and mouth during their entire visit.

In addition, just a reminder that all visits are **limited to 2 guests** and **visits must be conducted in the resident's room** unless they have a roommate, in which case see staff for direction.

It is extremely important that you notify a staff member immediately, if you have any signs or symptoms of a cold. These symptoms include: fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea.

Some volunteers and church groups have opted to wait out the 2 weeks and will not be coming in until our COVID situation is clear, it will be important to check the daily activity calendar on the café TV screen for updates.

In addition, entertainers and outings are on hold for at least 2 weeks to be sure everyone is healthy. We will reevaluate the situation on Monday 10/18.

Our flu shot clinic that was scheduled for 10/5 has been postponed until after all COVID results are in per our house physician's recommendation. Our new date is set for October 12th.
